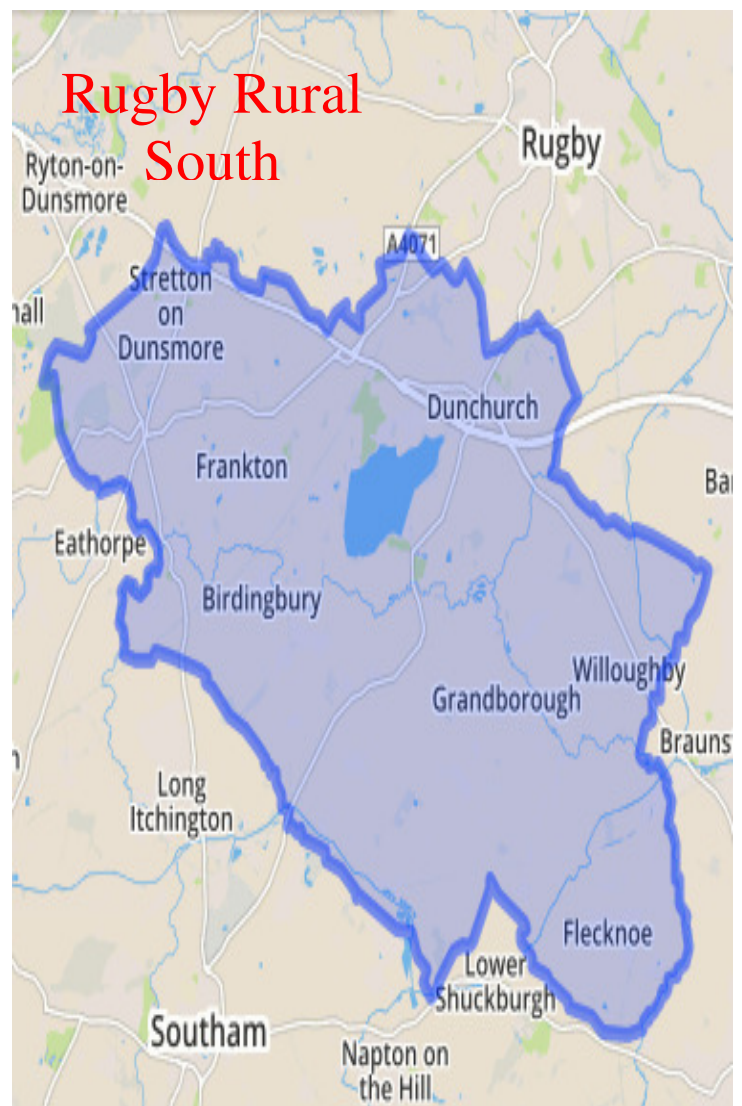

Good News

Water Safety

Warwickshire Police have been made aware of youths jumping from the water tower into Draycote Water Reservoir!!



There are a tragic amount of preventable deaths as people flocked to open water sites not suitable for swimming. These sites included rivers, quarries, lakes and reservoirs – all of which have many dangers. They look so inviting but can be deadly. Figures show that on average each year the summer months of July and August witness the most drowning deaths.

People need to listen to safety advice and never swim in non-lifeguarded areas unsuitable for swimming. It may seem an inviting way to cool off but there are deadly dangers such as extremely cold temperatures, unpredictable currents, uneven depths and unknown debris or objects people can get injured or caught in.

Cold Water Shock can happen at any time of the year including just summer. When you jump, dive or fall into cold water, there's an involuntary 'gasp' as the water hits your skin – you won't be able to control your breathing. During Cold Shock your blood pressure rises and heart rate increases, and most people (even the best of swimmers) start to panic.

Crime prevention Advice



'Sheduction' - simple tips to keep the contents of your shed safe this summer

Cars, bikes, tools, sporting equipment and other valuable items are often kept in garages and sheds. Keep them secure by fitting an alarm or a good quality lock.

Keep your fences, gates, sheds, outbuildings and walls in good repair to stop intruders getting in

Hang old net curtains on the inside of the windows to hide the contents of your shed

- Chain large items such as bicycles together - it is much more difficult for a thief to carry away a number of large, heavy items all at once
- Mark your garden tools and equipment with your postcode and house number
- Grow thorny plants and bushes to prevent unwelcome people from entering your garden
- Fit grilles or mesh to the windows
- Register your property at www.immobilise.com

Remember the tools and equipment you keep in your shed could be used to force entry into your home - causing even more expense and hassle in the long run.

Crime Overview

Anti Social Behaviour:

Burglary:

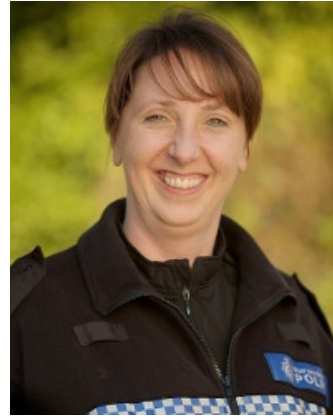

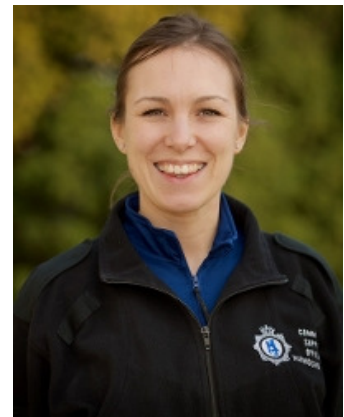
