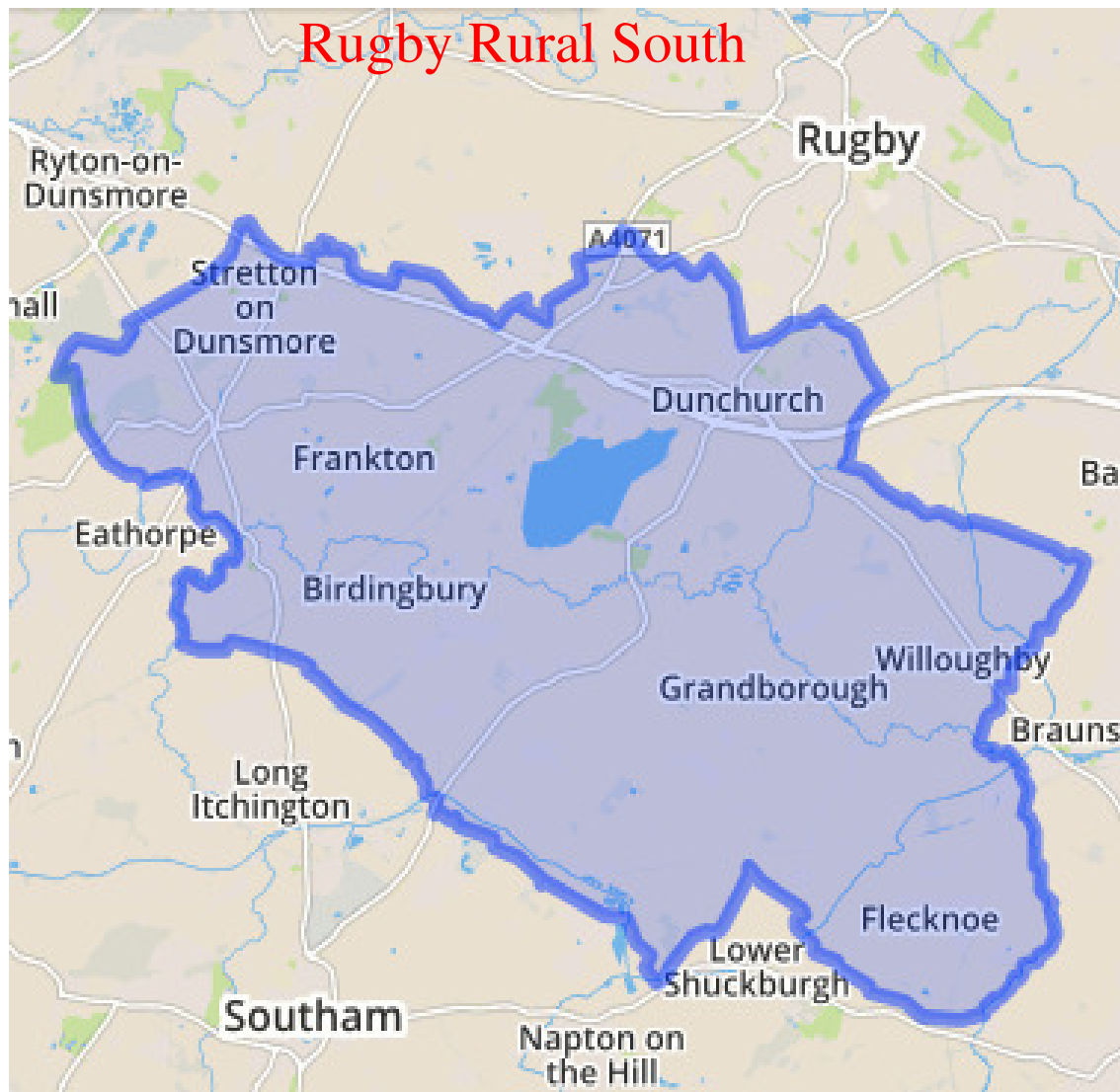

# Crime Overview

This section looks at the crimes of public interest that have occurred on the Rugby Rural South Safer Neighbourhood Team policing area. Below is a brief summary of some of the incidents that have been reported to us over the last month:

## ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR:

**Inc 218-20.05.2018** – Marton ,Oxford Road – On 20.05.2018 at 14:20 hrs Police received a report about 5 off road motorbikes being ridden around.

**Inc 513-21.05.2018** – Draycote Water, - On 21.05.2018 at 23:40 Police received a report about vehicle causing antisocial behaviour outside entrance to Draycote Water Countryside park.

## BURGLARY:

**Inc 77-10.05.2018** – Meadow Close, Stretton on Dunsmore – Between 21:00 on 09.05.2018 and 09:15 on 10.05.2018 unknown offender/s have broken into a van, power tools were stolen.

**Inc 155-10.05.2018** – Birdingbury Rd, Frankton – Between 10:30 on 02.05.2018 and 10:00 on 10.05.2018 offenders unknown have stolen a spear wheel from a Landrover Discovery.

**Inc. 400- 13.05.2018** – Adkinsone Ave, Dunchurch – unknown offenders have caused damage to two vehicles parked on the grass verge.

**Inc 11-14.05.2018** -Daventry Road, Dunchurch – Approx. 00:14 on 14.05.2018 hrs unknown offender have caused damage to Jaguar XJR, by hitting it with a hammer.

**Inc 75-18.05.2018**-Bilton Lane, Dunchurch – Between 03:00-04:00 hrs on 18.05.2018 unknown offenders have gained entry to a vehicle parked on the drive, searched has been

conducted nothing stolen.

**Inc 82-18.05.2018** – Weston Close, Dunchurch – Between 03:00- 04:00 hrs on 18.05.2018 unknown offender/s have gained entry to insecure vehicle, nothing was taken.

**THEFT:**

**Inc 330-07.05.2018** – Coventry Road, Dunchurch between 13:38 and 13:42 on 05.05.2018 unknown offender made off in Black BMW without paying for fuel.

**Inc 154-16.05.2018**- London Road, Stretton on Dunsmore on 11.05.2018 at 23:10 unknown offender/s have made off without paying for fuel in a white panel van.

## Reporting Incidents

Please do not report crime or other incidents via Twitter or other forms of Social Media ? Please call 101 or 999 in an emergency. Additional information is often required by officers in order for the police to act upon any information given.

Please view the advice below on which number you should ring.

999 is for reporting emergency situations only; below is a helpful mnemonic to remember when to use it.

- P** - Phone 999 only if
- O** - Offenders are nearby
- L** - Life is at risk
- I** - Injury is caused or threatened
- C** - Crime or disorder is in progress
- E** - Emergency situations

### What is 101?

101 is now the number to call when you want to get through to your local police when it is less urgent than 999. It is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Calls to 101 from land lines and mobile networks cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day you call or how long you are on the phone.

### When should I use 101?

- If you have had a minor traffic collision.
- If your property has been damaged.
- If your car has been stolen.
- If you suspect drug dealing.
- If you have been burgled and there are no offenders on scene.
- If you have witnessed a crime.
- If you have information about criminals in your local area.
- If you have seen a missing person.
- If you need crime prevention advice.
- If you want to speak to a local police officer/ your local Safer Neighbourhood Team.
- If you want to speak to the police about any other incident that doesn't require an immediate response.
- If you want to make us aware of any policing issues in your local area.

## PLEASE BE AWARE

Over past few weeks Police received reports of letters being received by members of the public in UK with a white powder in.

If you receive such letters you are to contact the police as a matter of urgency.

The 'Remove, Remove, Remove' advice should be given to members of the public who **report a white powder** incident as per the below guidelines:

- Keep the number of people who handle the letter and the envelope to a minimum – this is to allow Police the best chance to identify the sender through the use of forensic techniques and minimise the risk of harm.**

- Place the letter and the envelope in a clean plastic bag or similar (a sandwich bag or freezer bag for example) as this will stop further contamination**

- Call the local Police and inform them, they will assess what you have received and know the procedure to follow, whether the letter is part of this series or not**



## Team priorities:

1. Speed checks to detect traffic offences for Rugby Rural South.
2. Patrols around Rugby Rural South schools to prevent parking issues.
