Rural Crime Prevention

The Parish Council has opted to take part in the Police led Rural Crime Prevention Initiative. More details will be released as soon as they are available.

Speed Watch

The Speed Watch Team continues to monitor traffic within Stretton and Princethorpe on the Fosse Way. The Speed Watch Team have also now been granted permission to monitor traffic on School Lane in addition to Fosse Way. As further investment into reducing speeding through our village, the Parish Council have purchased wheelie bin stickers, reminding motorists of the speed limits and encouraging them to slow down! If you would like a sticker for your wheelie bin they will be available free of charge from the Parish Clerk or any of the Parish Councillors. They are a great visual reminder to drive safely. It is also believed that temporary signs of this nature have a greater effect than more permanent signs. With that in mind, a banner with the same message is being produced, and will be hung in a variety of locations around the village throughout the year. Cllr Haywood is also liaising with Knightlow School, with a view to promoting a scheme entitled 'Parents Safer Driving Promise.'

Bins

Three new grit bins have been purchased by the Parish Council and will be located on Orchard Way, Hill Crescent (or Croft Close) and on School Lane (at the junction of Plott Lane). These will be installed in time for autumn/winter 2018. A new dog waste bin is also on order to replace the one at Fosse Way Playing Field which is broken.

Plott Lane Recreation Ground

There will be limited access to the Skate Park for a short period during July as repairs are made to the quarter pipe. It should be reopened and functional for the school summer holidays. The Parish Council is also considering laying a track around the perimeter of the playing field which can be used for running, or walking around particularly when the field is muddy during the autumn and winter months. Quotes are being currently being obtained and when something more 'concrete' has been decided details will be shared in the Pendulum.

Emergency Plan
